The public hearing on an application for a Downtown Revitalization Grant was taken up at 7:00 p.m. The grant requests \$30,000 in Community Development Block Grant funds to improve and rehabilitate the downtown area and reduce the slum and blight conditions that currently exist. Matching funds of \$7100 would be required of the City.

According to Jennifer Wolf of Dawson Area Development, the funds could be used for such things as promotions and programs, upper story housing and facades of existing buildings and historic preservation. The application is due March 19 and will require letters of support from the City and local businesses. This is a new grant and applicants are limited to the eleven Certified Economic Development communities, of which Gothenburg is one.

Denise Romatzke of Ribbons and Roses floral shop spoke in support of the grant by voicing her concern about the dwindling downtown area and help for the established businesses there. Economic development and pursuit of bigger retailers and industry is a good thing but she would like to see some assistance for the shops in the downtown retail area.

The Chamber Retail Promotion committee, Community Development Office, and Administrator Clymer will meet to discuss specific needs. The recent Comprehensive Plan provides excellent information for assistance developing the application and plan of action.
