The aluminum fishing pier originally specified in the Lake Helen plan was removed due to available funds. The Game & Parks Commission has now proposed a wood pier and the funds to construct it. With the addition of \$100,000, the Commission share of the project has grown from \$500,000 to \$600,000. The additional \$100,000 will construct a \$57,000 ADA accessible pier and the balance will expand the parking area. The aluminum pier would have cost \$84,000.
