

ORDINANCE NO. 261

Section 5-12-1 Sale of Liquor Restricted:

An Ordinance to amend Article 12 of the Gothenburg Municipal Code, providing for sale of alcoholic liquors; establishing certain regulations for the sale of such liquors; establishing certain regulations regarding premises where such liquor is sold; repealing all other ordinances in conflict herewith; and prescribing when this ordinance shall be in full force and effect.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL

OF THE CITY OF GOTHENBURG, DAWSON COUNTY, NEBRASKA:

5-12-1 Sale of Liquor Restricted

Section 5-12-1 of the Gothenburg Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

No person, firm, or corporation shall within the city sell at retail any alcoholic liquors, including beer, on the day of any national, state, county or municipal election, including primary elections, during the time the polls are open in said city.


No person, firm, or corporation, except private clubs, shall within said City sell at retail any alcoholic liquors for consumption on the premises on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday, except as hereinafter provided. It shall be unlawful for any retailer of beer to dispense beer later than 11:45 P.M. on the secular days, except Saturday which said hour to be 12:45 A.M., Sunday, for consumption upon the premises. All establishments selling beer for consumption on their premises shall allow no one on said premises except their employees after the hour of 12:00 midnight on the secular days except Saturday which said time shall be 1:00 A.M. Sunday.

Repeal of Prior Ordinances in Conflict. --- All ordinances and parts of ordinances passed and approved prior to the passage and approval of this ordinance and in conflict therewith are hereby repealed.

When Operative. --- This ordinance shall be in full force and take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication according to law.
