

A meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Gothenburg, Nebraska, was held at the City Hall in said City on the 15th day of August, 1995, at seven o'clock p.m. Present were: Mayor: Richard L. Blase; Council Members: Larry Franzen, Joyce Hudson, Ken Christensen

Absent: Gary Norseen

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in The Gothenburg Times, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Affidavit of Publication attached to these minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to the Mayor and all members of the Council. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the Mayor and Council of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Council Member Christensen introduced Ordinance No. _____ entitled:

ORDINANCE NO. 632

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GOTHENBURG, NEBRASKA, CREATING STREET IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 108; DEFINING THE SAME AND THE LIMITS THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR PAVING, GRADING, CURBING AND GUTTERING OF SUCH OTHER WORK AS IS NECESSARY AND INCIDENTAL THERETO; PROVIDING FOR PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS, ESTIMATES OF COST AND SECURING OF BIDS; PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF SUCH WORK AND OTHER EXPENSES INCIDENTAL THERETO; PROVIDING FOR ASSESSMENT OF THE COST OF SAID IMPROVEMENTS; PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF DISTRICT IMPROVEMENT WARRANTS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES AND DISTRICT BONDS; PROVIDING FOR REPEALING OF ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THERewith; AND PROVIDING THE TIME WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT AND ORDERING THE PUBLICATION OF THE ORDINANCE IN PAMPHLET FORM.

and moved that the statutory rule requiring reading on three different days be suspended. Council Member Franzen seconded the motion to suspend the rules and upon roll call, vote on the motion the following Council Members voted YEA: _____
Hudson, Franzen, Christensen

This following voted NAY: none.
The motion to suspend the rules was adopted by three-fourths of the Council and the statutory rule was declared suspended for consideration of said ordinance.

Said ordinance was then read by title and thereafter Council Member Franzen moved for final passage of the ordinance, which motion was seconded by Council Member Hudson. The Mayor then stated the questions was "Shall Ordinance No. 632 be passed and adopted?" Upon roll call vote, the following Council Members voted YEA: _____

Christensen, Hudson, Franzen.

The following voted NAY: none.

The passage and adoption of said ordinance having been concurred in by a majority of all members of the Council, the Mayor declared the ordinance adopted and the Mayor in the presence of the Council signed and approved the ordinance and the Clerk attested the passage and approval of the same and affixed her signature thereto and ordered the Ordinance to be published in pamphlet form as provided therein. A true, correct and complete copy of said ordinance is as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 632

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF GOTHENBURG, NEBRASKA, CREATING STREET IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. _____; DEFINING THE SAME AND THE LIMITS THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR PAVING, GRADING, CURBING AND GUTTERING OF SUCH OTHER WORK AS IS NECESSARY AND INCIDENTAL THERETO; PROVIDING FOR PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS, ESTIMATES OF COST AND SECURING OF BIDS; PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF SUCH WORK AND OTHER EXPENSES INCIDENTAL THERETO; PROVIDING FOR ASSESSMENT OF THE COST OF SAID IMPROVEMENTS; PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE OF DISTRICT IMPROVEMENT WARRANTS OR BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES AND DISTRICT BONDS; PROVIDING FOR REPEALING OF ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; AND PROVIDING THE TIME WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT AND ORDERING THE PUBLICATION OF THE ORDINANCE IN PAMPHLET FORM.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF GOTHENBURG, NEBRASKA:

Section 1. Street Improvement District No. 108 of the City of Gothenburg, Nebraska is hereby created.

Section 2. Said Street Improvement District No. 108 shall include and encompass the designated portions of the following streets in the City of Gothenburg, Nebraska, and the limits, boundaries and improvements are defined and established as follows:

STREET IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 108

THE STREET TO BE IMPROVED BY PAVING, GRADING, CURBING AND GUTTERING AND INCIDENTAL WORK CONNECTED THEREWITH IS:

All public streets lying within the Gothenburg Improvement Company Second Addition, in the City of Gothenburg, Dawson County, Nebraska.

THE ABUTTING PROPERTY TO BE INCLUDED IN THE DISTRICT IS LOCATED WITHIN THE FOLLOWING BOUNDARIES:

That property bounded on the west by a line 300 feet west of and parallel to the center line of Cottonwood Drive bounded on the north by a line 1000 feet north of and parallel to the south line of the Southeast 1/4 of

Section 15, Township 11 North, Range 25, West of the 6th P.M., bounded on the east by a line 660 feet east of and parallel to the centerline of Cottonwood Drive and bounded on the south by the south line of the Southeast 1/4 of Section 15, Township 11 North, Range 25, all located in Dawson County, Nebraska.

Section 3. The City's special engineer has mad detailed plans and specifications for said improvements and an estimate of the cost thereof, which have been approved by the City Council. The Mayor and City Clerk are authorized to enter into a contact on behalf of the city for such work upon compliance with and in accordance with advertising, bidding and contracting procedures prescribed in Nebraska Revised Statues Section 17-568.01 (1987). The City Council shall have and hereby reserves the right to reject any and all bids received.

Section 4. The work and improvements shall be made at public cost, but special assessments on any properties determined by the City Council to be especially benefitted thereby, proportionate to benefits, shall be levied to reimburse the City to the extent provided by law.

Section 5. The District created hereby is separate and distinct, and if the District is objected to by owners of record title representing more that 50% of the front footage of the property directly abutting on the street, street, ally or alleys to be improved, the work will not be constructed in the District.

Section 6. For the purpose of paying for the paving, grading, widening, curbing and guttering or other necessary improvements incidental thereto, the Mayor and City Council of the City may issue district improvement warrants or bond anticipation notes of Street Improvement District No. 108 of the City of Gothenburg, Nebraska in the form and manner provided by law.

Section 7. To effect the final payment and retirement of said warrants or notes, and to pay for the cost of paving, grading, widening, curbing and guttering or other necessary improvements incidental thereto, the Mayor and City Council shall issue bonds in the form and manner provided by law.


Section 8. This ordinance shall be published one time in The Gothenburg Times, a legal newspaper published and o general circulation in the City of Gothenburg, Nebraska, and shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

Section 9. After the passage, approval and publication of this ordinance as in Section 8 provided, there shall be published, as provided by law, in The Gothenburg Times, a legal newspaper published and of general circulation in the City of Gothenburg, Nebraska, a notice with respect to the Districts created by the terms of this ordinance, which notice shall


provided, among other things, that if owners of record title representing more than 50% of the front footage of the property directly abutting on the street, streets, alley and alleys to be improved in said District shall file with the City Clerk within twenty (20) days after the first publication of said notice, writing objections to the creation of said District, the improvements in such District shall not be made as provided in this ordinance.

Section 10. All provisions of any prior ordinances of the City of conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
