DISCUSSION ITEMS:

Deb Egenberger-Gothenburg Chamber of Commerce discussed closure of a downtown street for the Magic on Main Street Event set for Tuesday December 7th. The closure would be Lake Avenue from Ninth Street to Tenth Street for activities.

After no further discussion Janssen moved, Kennedy seconded, the approval of closure of Lake Avenue between 9th and 10th streets for the Magic on Main Street Event set for Tuesday December 7th. Roll call vote: Yea –Kennedy, Buddenberg, Richeson, Janssen. No – None. Motion carried.

City Administrator Greer introduced Ordinance 1005 -2021 Utility Rate Change. This ordinance increases rates for Electric 5%, Sewer 5%, and Solid Waste 6% services to offset price increases for supplies, services, and fees. The current consumer price index indicates a 6.4 % inflation rate.

Clerk Bussinger read Ordinance 1005 -2021 Utility Rate Change. AN ORDINANCE SETTING FORTH ALL UTILITY FEES AND CHARGES IN A COMPREHENSIVE SCHEDULE FOR THE CITY OF GOTHENBURG; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

After no further discussion Janssen moved, Kennedy seconded, to approve Ordinance 1005 -2021 Utility Rate Change. Roll call vote: Yea –Kennedy, Buddenberg, Richeson, Janssen. No – None. Motion carried.

City Administrator Greer discussed Resolution 2021-21 Continuation of 457 Plan. This resolution is a requirement of the city's retirement program administrator which has just changed from Mass Mutual to Empower. The change in companies necessitates approval of a new resolution from the City Council.

After no further discussion Kennedy moved, Richeson seconded, to approve Resolution 2021-21 Continuation of 457 Plan. Roll call vote: Yea –Kennedy, Buddenberg, Richeson, Janssen. No – None. Motion carried.

City Administrator Greer discussed the Boarding Agreement with Eastside Animal Center for animals picked up by the Police Department. This agreement approves a cost increase for animal impound fees.

After no further discussion Richeson moved, Buddenberg seconded, to approve Boarding Agreement with Eastside Animal Center. Roll call vote: Yea –Kennedy, Buddenberg, Richeson, Janssen. No – None. Motion carried.

Mayor Hudson discussed the appointment of new fireman Jacob Rosse to the Volunteer Fire Department.

After no further discussion Janssen moved, Richeson seconded, to approve appointment of new fireman Jacob Rosse. Roll call vote: Yea –Kennedy, Buddenberg, Richeson, Janssen. No – None. Motion carried.

City Administrator Greer discussed Resolution 2021-22 Keno Funds. This resolution is to mirror the state law for use of the keno funds of community betterment.

After no further discussion Kennedy moved, Janssen seconded, to approve Resolution 2021-22 Keno Funds. Roll call vote: Yea – Kennedy, Buddenberg, Richeson, Janssen. No – None. Motion carried.

City Administrator Greer discussed Resolution 2021-23 Update Fee Schedule (multiple updates). This resolution has multiple increases to city fees, deposits, permits, and rents to offset costs of service for various city functions.

After no further discussion Kennedy moved, Janssen seconded, to approve Resolution 2021-23 Update Fee Schedule (multiple updates). Roll call vote: Yea –Kennedy, Buddenberg, Richeson, Janssen. No – None. Motion carried.

City Administrator Greer discussed Resolution 2021-24 Year End Certification of the City Street Superintendent. This resolution is a state requirement for state funding naming Reed Miller as our Street Superintendent.

After no further discussion Kennedy moved, Richeson seconded, to approve 2021-24 Year End Certification of City Street Superintendent. Roll call vote: Yea – Kennedy, Buddenberg, Richeson, Janssen. No – None. Motion carried.

Noah Dea Park Director discussed proposals for park mower. The city received two proposals first from Akrs for \$10,450 available now and the second from Landmark \$11,400 available June 2022.

After no further discussion Janssen moved, Richeson seconded, to approve proposal for park mower from Arks for \$10,450. Roll call vote: Yea –Kennedy, Buddenberg, Richeson, Janssen. No – None. Motion carried.

City Administrator Greer discussed Resolution 2021-25 Economic Development Fund (LB840) Application for the Dawson Area Development organization Annual support and Grant Agreement. This resolution is changing the funds that were previously paid out of the Old Sales Tax Fund to the LB840 Fund for \$26,000 in annual support.
