COMMUNITY COMMENTS:

Mayor Janssen commented that the City Crew did a fabulous job with the recent snow removal. Administrator Greer reported that the 1987 snow blower has once again broken down and is probably beyond repair. A new one would cost approximately \$227,000.00 which is not in the current budget but is scheduled to be in the next budget year. They have already taken bids for a new one.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

Change Order No B for \$5,910.97 on 2024 Infrastructure 126-A-042 was discussed. Greer stated that these things are outside of the contractor's scope.

Richeson moved, Warner seconded, to approve Change Order B as presented. Roll call vote: Yea–Buddenberg, Richeson, Colwell, Warner. No – none. Motion carried.

Code 152.057 Fence, Wall and Hedge Regulations were discussed. Shane Gruber told the Council that currently both commercial and industrial zones are allowed to have 6-foot fences, but at the discretion of the Building Inspector, they can go up to 8 feet. The administration recommends that only industrial zoned property be allowed to go up to 8 foot and that anything else must be approved by the Board of Adjustments, Planning and Zoning and the City Council. The council instructed the Administrator to make a change in the ordinance to be reviewed at the next Council Meeting.

The Liability Claim from Sureyma Wozny was discussed. She has presented paperwork and pictures saying that her tire was slashed by construction that the City was doing.

Richeson made a motion, Colwell seconded that the Liability Claim from Sureyma Wozny be submitted to our insurance. Greer mentioned that State Law dictates that if she is not happy with the outcome from the insurance, her only other recourse is to sue the City. Roll Call Vote: Yea - Warner, Buddenberg, Richeson, Colwell. No – none. Motion carried.

Council President introduced Ordinance 1042 Utility Rates (Solid Waste Update 2025)

Richeson moved, Colwell seconded that statutory rule requiring reading on 3 different days be suspended for introduced Ordinance. Roll call vote: Yea – Buddenberg, Richeson, Colwell, Warner. No – none. Motion carried. Mayor Janssen declared motion adopted by vote of Council and statutory rule suspended for consideration of Ordinance 1042.

Deputy Clerk Rubenthaler read Ordinance 1042. AN ORDINANCE SETTING FORTH ALL UTILITY FEES AND CHARGES IN A COMPREHENSIVE SCHEDULE FOR THE CITY OF GOTHENBURG. PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Warner moved, Richeson seconded to approve final passage of the Ordinance 1016. Roll call vote: Yea – Colwell, Warner, Richeson, Buddenberg. No – none. Motion carried. Mayor Janssen declared Ordinance #1042 adopted.

The February 4th Council Meeting date and time was discussed. Buddenberg made a motion; Colwell seconded, to meet at 7:00 p.m. for the February 4th meeting. Roll call vote: Yea - Warner, Buddenberg, Richeson, Colwell. No – none. Motion carried.

Buddenberg moved, Richeson seconded, to adjourn the meeting at 5:54 p.m. Roll call vote: Yea–Buddenberg, Richeson, Colwell, Warner. No – None. Motion carried.
